Purpose of the Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Community Meeting is a meeting of all the local government electors for the parish. It is NOT a Meeting of the Community Council, which the public can participate in. Anyone may attend but only registered electors of Queen's Park may speak and vote.

Will I be able to ask questions and make suggestions?

Yes, any registered elector may ask questions of the Council, which will usually be answered by the Chairman, the Locum Director, or a designated Councillor.

An elector may also make suggestions and comment on anything pertinent to the people of Queen's Park. This will be welcomed and is the whole purpose of the meeting.
