Cllr Gill Fitzhugh informed the Committee that she would like to do a 'big draw' event, ideally in October. The event would be for children and involves drawing/painting. The Committee requested a more detailed report for the event at the next meeting.

### **MINUTES**

Minutes of the Communications and Events Committee meeting – 4<sup>th</sup> November 2015

### **FEEDBACK FROM FIREWORKS AND WINTER FAIR**

Residents and councillors reported that they did not like the music the DJ played for the fireworks event. He also tuned up very late. Otherwise, everyone agreed it was a good event. The Police were very helpful in closing the surrounding roads to the Gardens and stewarding. There needs to be a more efficient way of applying for licences from Westminster.

The winter fair was very windy and got dark quickly which made selling items more difficult. However, residents enjoyed the event and suggested it should be longer. More volunteers were needed

## **QUEEN'S PARK VOICE**

### Update on contents of next issue

The Chairman provided an update on what content is going into the next issue. It was decided that the Gala Award from Paddington (which was awarded to Cllr Ryan Dalton and Director, Mike Simpson, for organising the summer festival) should not go in the Voice but will be publicised in the next e-newsletter. However, Cllr Ryan Dalton wanted to clarify that he did not nominate himself for the award following rumours he had.

### Update on delivery

The Council tried hiring two young men to deliver the Voice but it did not work well. Angie Durrance, who coordinates delivery of the Voice for the Council, has two 15 year olds who could do the work. However, the Council decided the post should be advertised to the wider community. The advertisement should be aimed at young people but this might require setting up a youth enterprise scheme, which the Director will investigate.

## **REPORT ON COUNCIL COMMUNICATIONS**

The Director gave a report on the Council's website, social media activity and newsletter. The website is regularly updated but more content is needed, as well as more activity on social media. However, he stated it was important to only post and mention relevant/important issues rather than posting for the sake of it. Hosting an event for the launch of the Council's business plan was also raised which everyone agreed was a good idea

**C&E.316**      **RESOLVED** that an event should take place with a budget of £500 to launch the business plan, inviting local organisations and Westminster City Council officials in April.

### **UPDATE ON NOTICEBOARDS**

The Council currently has one noticeboard outside the Beethoven. However, the original decision was to have 4 around the ward and the Committee agreed again that there should be more. However, the committee was unsure where they should go. It was decided to defer the decision until the next meeting.
