MINUTES

Minutes of the Neighbourhood Planning meeting – 4th February 2015

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

To discuss any developments relating to the Neighbourhood Plan for Queen's Park

The Chairman informed the Committee that the majority of the money from the Locality fund for the Neighbourhood Plan has been spent. However, QPCC has been awarded a grant of £20,000 from the Mayor of London's High Street Fund. Further details regarding the terms and conditions of the fund have not yet been received but the Working Group for the Neighbourhood Plan will meet to discuss next steps. Next steps will include taking over a local shop for month or two, this is part of the funding process which requires

QPCC to have a presence on the High Street for a while, as well as hosting 4 themed workshops.

SPACEHIVE FUNDING APPLICATIONS

To discuss and provide any updates on Spacehive funding applications regarding sound sculptures in Queen's Park Gardens and regeneration of Harrow Road

The two QPCC Spacehive accounts for the High Street and sound sculptures for Queen's Park Gardens were discussed. The High Street account relates to the money that QPCC has just been awarded from the Mayor of London's High Street Fund and will terminate at the end of March. The account for the sound sculptures corresponds to Experian funding of up to £5,000 but has yet to be verified by Spacehive and is therefore still inactive.

COMMUNITY ASSETS

To discuss QPCC's current list of community assets and the process of transferring an asset to QPCC

The current list of community assets was reviewed. The Director will look into adding the BT building on Harrow Road to the list, as previously agreed, as well as look into a building on Beethoven Street which is on the market.
